Currently Guest Professor of Chinese at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, Dr. Liu has authored and edited nine books and has written eloquently and brilliantly on Chinese literature, art, and civilization.

**Dr. Shi Liu is Professor of Chinese at Tsinghua University, Beijing, China, where he also serves as Vice Department Chair, advisor to doctoral students, and Vice Deputy Editor of Tsinghua University Journal. He was a Guest Professor of Chinese at Sogang University, Republic of Korea, in 2003-04. His areas of research include classical Chinese literature, Tang and Song poems, Chinese calligraphy, Buddhism and literature, and Modern Chinese literature and culture.**
